BLAINE, Minn., (June 24, 2024) — The National Sports Center (NSC) is excited to announce that the 39th annual Target USA CUP will be taking place July 12-20, 2024. The 2024 tournament will welcome the largest number of players and referees from across the country and world in its history. There will be more than 1,180 teams participating over the eight-day event.

The event will feature over 2,300 soccer matches and a multitude of activities across the campus to keep players nourished, replenished, and entertained throughout the eight days.

The National Sports Center is one of the world's largest amateur sports facilities. The NSC operates over 100 unique programs and events in a variety of sports as well as hosting numerous national and international competitions. The facility boasts an annual attendance of over 4.2 million visitors each year. The NSC is a priceless, innovative and unique asset to Minnesota sports families, and to the local economy as well.

The campus covers nearly 700 acres, and includes 53 grass multi-use athletic fields, 9 turf fields, the eight-sheet Super Rink, the 18-hole Victory Links golf course, a 5,500-seat stadium, the indoor Sports Hall with an artificial turf field, the Sport Expo Center featuring basketball and volleyball courts, and a 180-bed residence hall.
